SOME FOOD FOR THOUGHT...

The Communion Table is central to our denominational and spiritual identity as Disciples of Christ. It represents many approaches to the Christian faith and is perhaps the most welcoming part of our worship service. Communion contains both personal and communal elements.

Personally, it is taken and ingested (literally and figuratively) in relation to Jesus Christ and our self-identity. We ask for forgiveness of sins and receive the Grace of God.

Communally, we share in a meal that moves us to think about our relationships with each other and the community in which we exist. We ask to receive our daily calling, to be moved by the Spirit, and to fulfill the Great Commission.

However. translating our experience at the Table can sometimes difficult. Our traditional practice of Table is removed from the social pressures we experience as soon as we walk out the door. I encourage you to think about and embrace the meaning of this ritual as it relates to your context. In what ways is it changing the way you speak, act, and listen to others? In what ways does it break down barriers between familiar and stranger? I wonder what life differences it would make.


