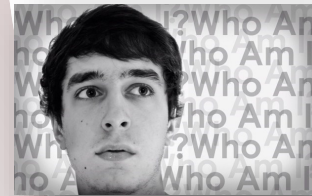
NEWS ABOUT "PRAISE AT THE BRIDGE"

Praise @ the Bridge kicked off last month and, we had a lot of fun and a lot to learn. Jennifer has done a great job of leading us through this new ministry and, there is more yet to be done. I believe this ministry will be a turning point in our church history because it is forcing us to think about how we do evangelism, how we connect to strangers and our neighbors, and how we reflect God's love in Mineral Wells. Jennifer and I are looking forward to seeing where this journey is taking us.

The theme for our last session was "Family." The activities focused on how different people of the Bible helped to make a safe place for their families and the people of God. One of the most popular activities was the Red Sea Escape where the families tried to race remote controlled trucks across the Red Sea to escape to freedom without their playdough people falling out! Another favorite was roasting marshmallows and making campfire craft with the story of Abraham and Sarah. The children shared that they had never roasted a marshmallow before and decided roasted marshmallows are delicious!

One of the most impactful conversations of the night was with a family whose grandson attended VBS several times. The Grandmother shared how excited her grandson was to come to VBS each year, how he loved getting mail (an invite to Praise@ the Bridge and pictures from last year's VBS) addressed to him, and how, even though his family attends the Methodist Church, he calls First Christian his church.

Hygiene Kits

Last year, the congregation collected hygiene items to make kits for the homeless. During Vacation Bible School, the kids put the kits together and prepared them to be given to those in need. A total of 14 kits were made with another 5 almost complete. The 14 completed kits were given out during our Christmas Brunch held on Christmas Day morning. We are now in need of items to make additional kits. To complete the 5 partial kits, one deodorant and four shampoos are needed. Listed below are the items included in the hygiene kits.

- Deodorant
- Toothbrush
- Toothpaste
- Body wash/ Soap
- Shampoo
- Washcloth
- (Some have floss, mouthwash, lotion, and hair conditioner)

Currently, we have 13 toothbrushes, 9 tubes of toothpaste, 9 bars of soap and 8 washcloths ready to be added to other needed items to make additional kits. Please donate as you feel led to this outreach ministry!

Clothing Items for Students

Palo Pinto Elementary needs some items for the emergency clothes closet. While they have all the little kid (Pre-K, Kindergarten) size clothes and socks are needed at this time, they are running short on the bigger kid sized socks and pull-on type pants. Currently, at Walmart in the Girls and Boys sections, there are pull-on type pants ranging in price from \$2- \$7. It is recommended to try to find neutral colors (i.e., solid blue instead of leopard print). In the Boys section, there are some sweatpants and athletic/ basketball type pull-on pants available on the clearance racks. Similarly, in the Girls section, there are sweatpants as well as thinner pull-on stretchy pants on the clearance racks.

Clothes Sizes:

Girls – sizes 7, 8, 10-12, 14-16
Boys- sizes 8, 10, 12, 14, 16, 18, 20

Sock Sizes:

Girls- to fit shoe sizes 2 through 11
Boys- to fit shoe sizes: 5 through 11

Clothing items donated should be placed in a plastic bag and labeled “PPES.” Otherwise, they may be taken to the Center of Life by accident.
